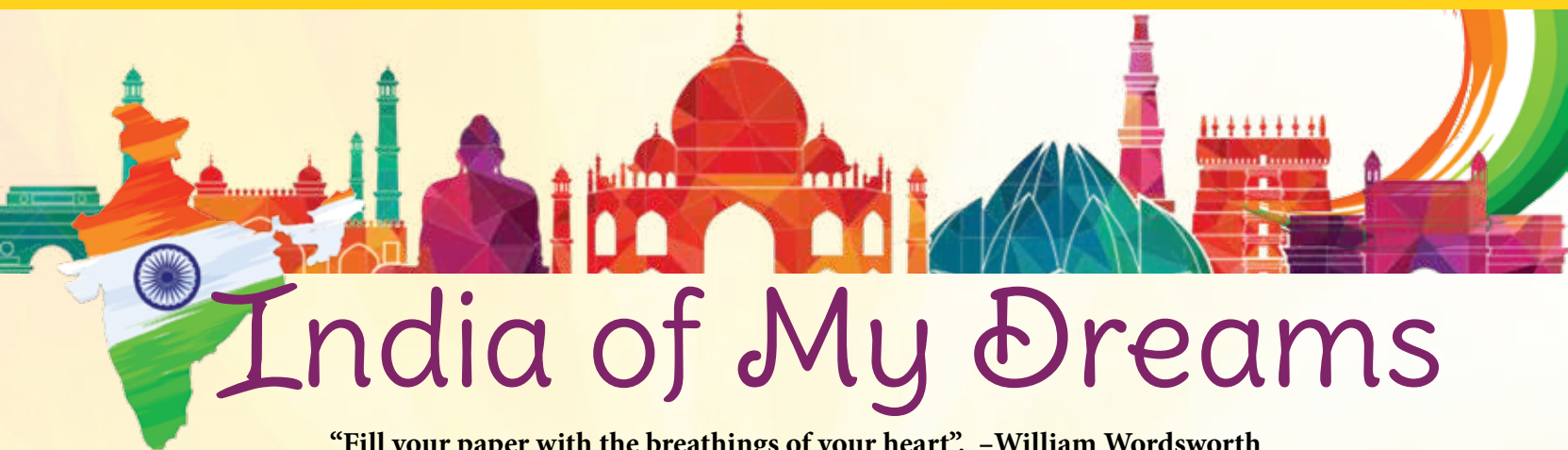

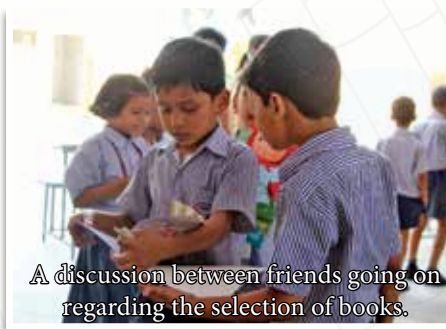

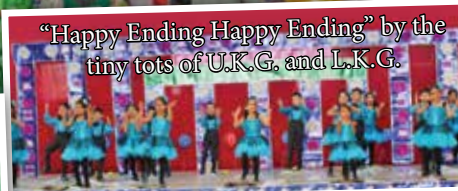

Puppet Show

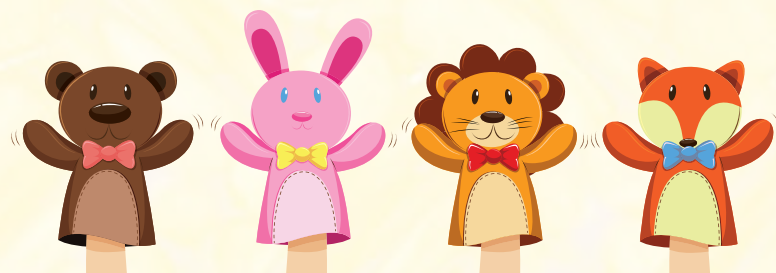

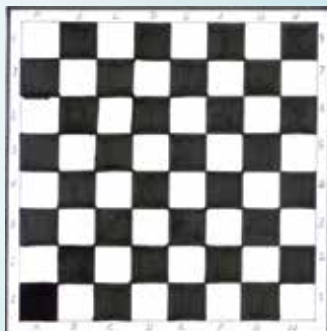
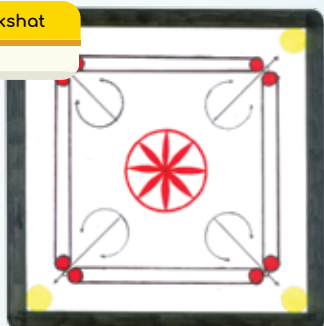
