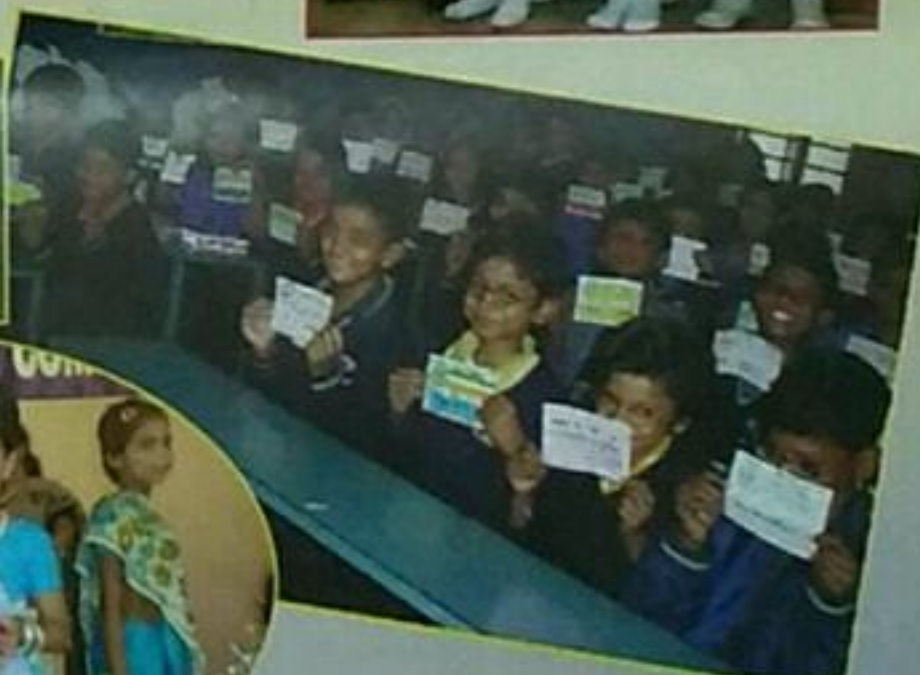

### HINDI ELOCUTION

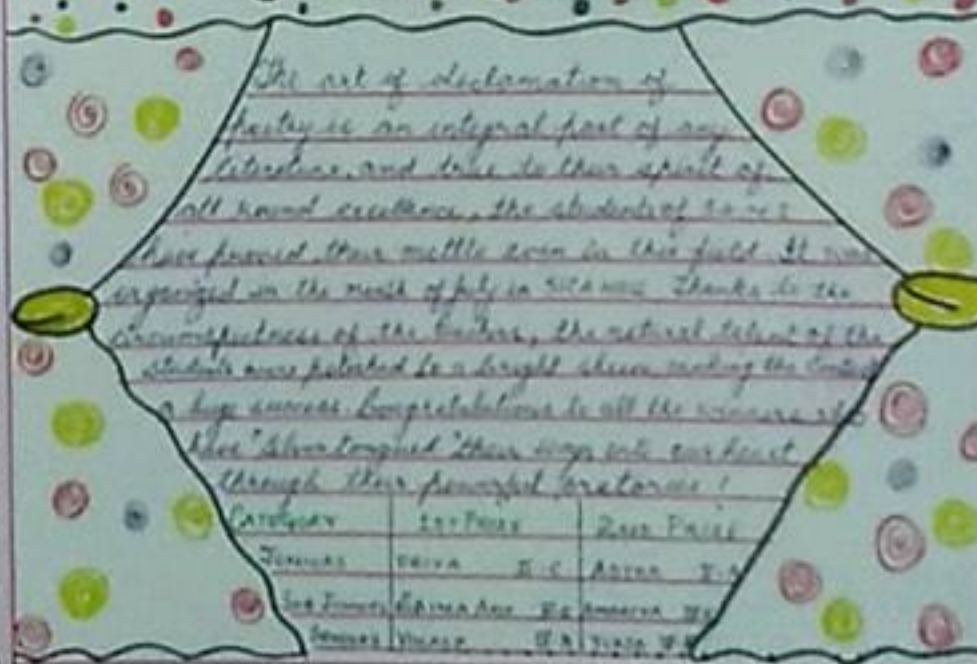

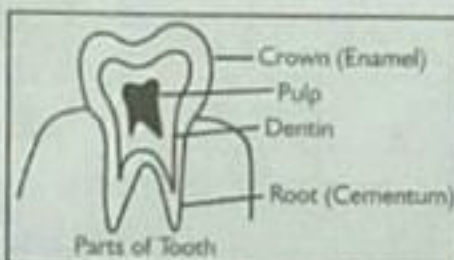
# DENTAL CHECK-UP WEEK

4. Gargle after every meal.

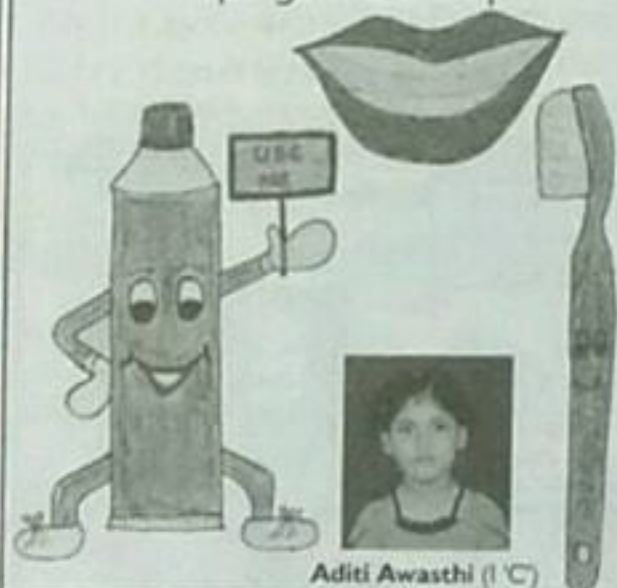
