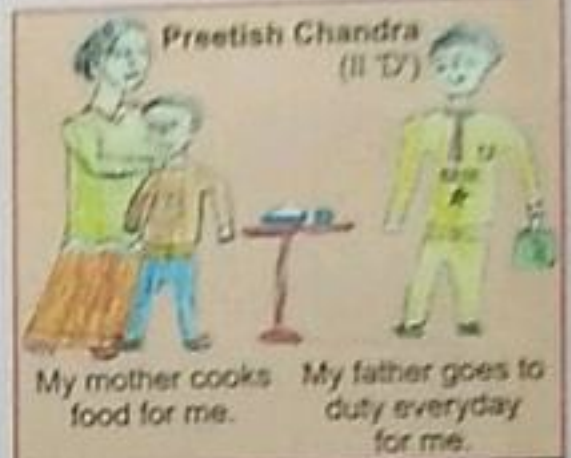

Toy of the Giving Week

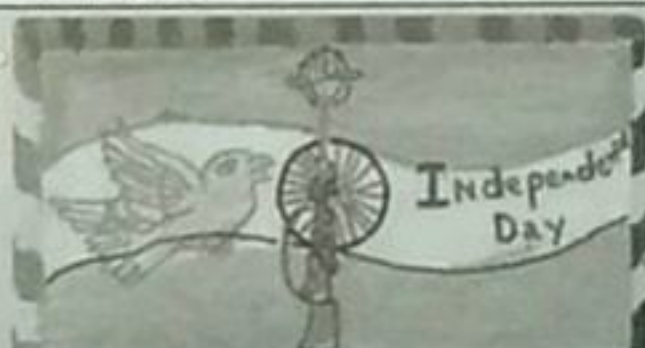

It is really an 'Asset' for us and it helps us in improving the weak areas identified by it.

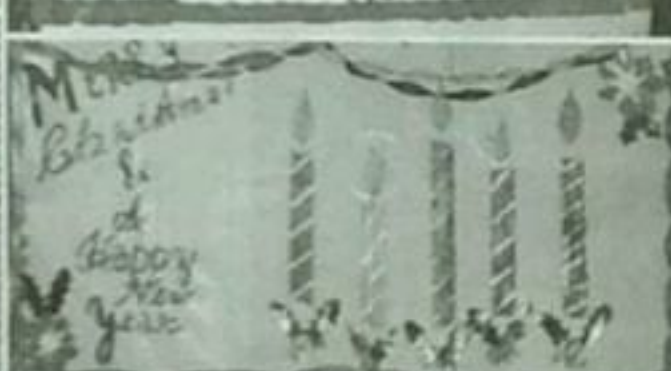

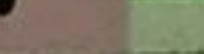
