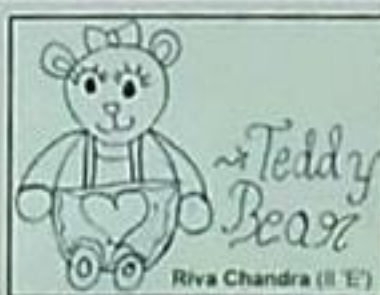

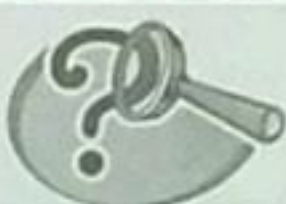
**Jaya Tiwari (II 'B')**

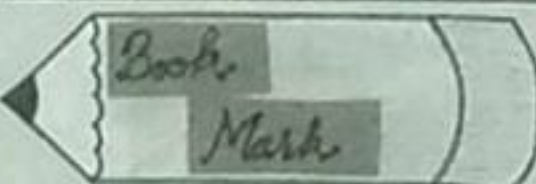
## Children's Day

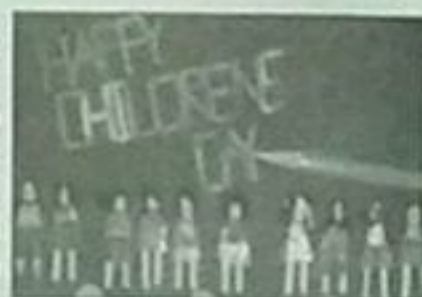
## CHILDREN'S DAY FUN
