


**Suhani Bharti (IV 'E')**


*Children's Day*




## TRYING THEIR HAND AT 'RINGING THE GIFT'




## CHILDREN'S DAY FUN

Children love Chacha Nehru that's why we celebrate every year Children's Day on 14 November. We played games and had fun.


**Sayana Chandra (III 'D')**


I bought the Jungle Book from the book fair. I liked it very much.


**SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR**


## Habit of Dettol, Habit of Health


